Safety for the newest drivers in the family

For those families with new drivers or kids about to get their driver's license, the show presents an opportunity to explore the latest innovations in safety to protect those new teen drivers. In a recent report, the U.S. Department of Transportation called innovations by car manufacturers a "revolution in safety." Advances in safety include driver assist or collision assist technologies that allow vehicles to sense the environment around them and assist drivers by alerting them to impending dangers. Many of these new technology options can be found in vehicles displayed on the auto show floor. Many manufacturers are increasing the type and variety of in-vehicle safety systems. Below are just a few examples of what you can find at the auto show.

The all-new 2016 Chevrolet Malibu features the debut of Teen Driver, a system that provides parents with a tool to help encourage safe driving habits for their kids, even when they are not in the car with them. Teen Driver supports safe driving habits by muting the audio of the radio or any device paired with the vehicle when front seat occupants aren't wearing their safety belts, and it gives audible and visual warnings when the vehicle is traveling faster than preset speeds.

Transporting younger kids? Safety experts acknowledge that the back seat is the safest place for children. Ford has begun to offer rear inflatable safety belts, which combine the attributes of safety belts and airbags in many of its vehicles. Rear inflatable safety belts provide additional protection for rear-seat passengers, who often are children or older adults more vulnerable to head, neck and chest injuries.

Subaru vehicles may be equipped with EyeSight, an extra set of eyes on the road, and if need be, an extra foot on the brake when you drive. When equipped with this safety feature, several Subaru models received the highest possible rating for front crash prevention by the IIHS.
